### **2021 FALL UPDATE**

Dear Members,

Thanks to the generous support of our membership and some exceptional financial donors, the Interior Alaska Land Trust has accomplished a great deal this year.

Through the incredible generosity of Jack and Carol Wilbur, we were able to permanently protect 152 acres of wetland habitat and critical trails in the Goldstream Valley greenbelt as well as 122 acres of the Cripple Creek watershed upstream from the Chinook Conservation Park. We also thank Felix Krause and Silke Schiewer, the original landowners of the Goldstream parcel, for contacting IALT and working with us to conserve it.

In recognition of Jack and Carol's tremendous gift to the greenspaces in the Interior, we are honored to announce the Wilburs as the recipients of the IALT's Fairbanks Land Conservationist of the Year Award.

As many of you may remember, founding IALT board member Merritt Helferrich passed away in 2019. His widow, April Crosby, has since pledged all proceeds from Merritt's memoir *Some Days You Eat the Bears* to the IALT in his memory. Merritt's dedication, experience and humor were invaluable to us as an organization and we are truly honored that his legacy continues to support our mission.


### ANNUAL MEETING
